Regional Coordination

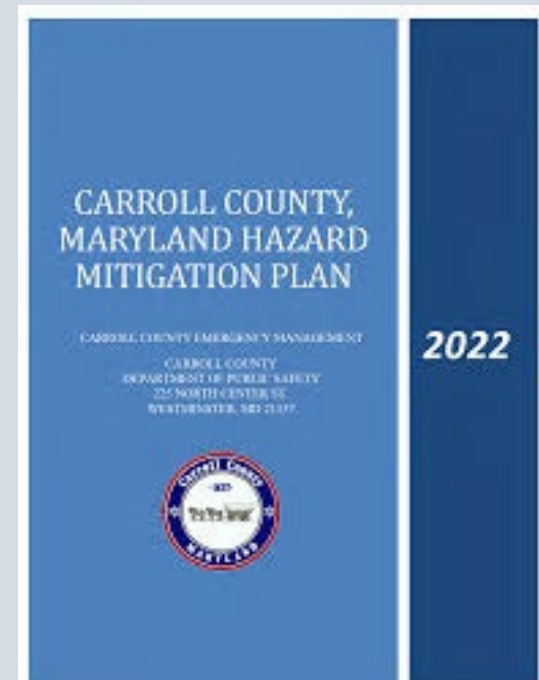
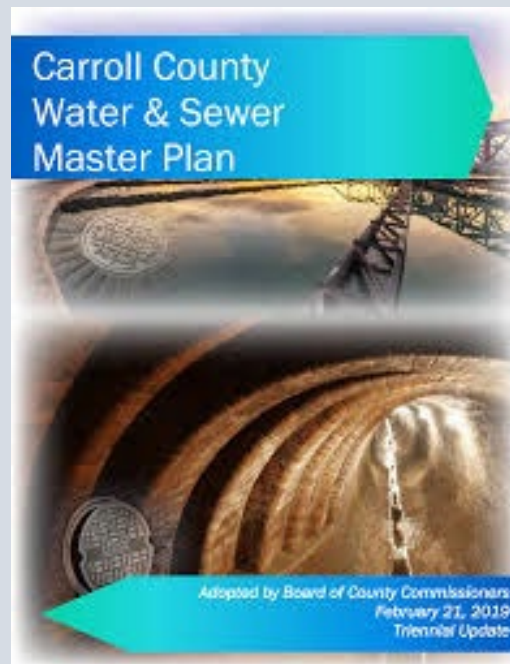
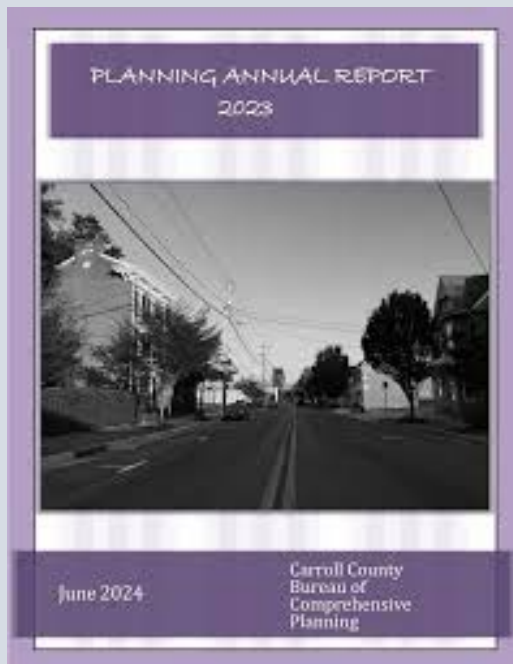
- Multi-county initiatives
