- vii. Monthly return on investment, based on known awards is approximately \$1,539,781 for compensation and pension.
- viii. Yearly return on investment, based on known awards is approximately \$47,991,848 since inception of the program in October 2013. Growth Rate from 12/2021 to 6/2022 is 14%.
- ix. Rick Pollard reported that two older Vietnam Veterans received assistance. The first has kidney disease, which is not on the approved illness list for those exposed to Agent Orange. He needed to be evaluated by his doctor and evidence was needed to prove that his kidney disease was due to his exposure. Rick attended the appointment with the permission of the Veteran. The doctor wrote a letter explaining the relationship between his exposure to Agent Orange and his kidney disease. The Veteran received 100% of the benefits he was owed. The second Veteran has lung cancer due to his exposure to Agent Orange. The claim was originally turned down. He was assisted in refiling the claim and received a full settlement.
- b. Veteran's Shuttle Report May 2022:
 - i. 20 Veterans were served with 11 home pick-ups
 - 1. Baltimore 12 Veterans served with 22 trips
 - 2. Fort Detrick 2 Veterans served with 3 trips
 - 3. Glen Burnie 1 Veteran served with 1 trip
 - 4. Martinsburg 5 Veterans served with 7 trips
 - 5. Total cost \$3,743.25
- c. <u>Employment Initiatives for Veterans Update</u> (John Veney) Resource Fair was a success. John met with 15 Veterans and seven appointments were made. Unemployment is down for Veterans with a current rate of 2.9% (4.4% last year) according to Department of Labor & Statistics. He has a case load of 11 Veterans this quarter. He is in partnership with Carroll Technology to assist Veterans in receiving free laptop computers.

	4. <u>Update on Veteran Direct Home and Community Based Services Program Grant</u> (Francine Hahn) – Three clients
	are being served. A new family was recently assisted. They live in a senior subsidized unit, so the amount of
	funding needed to be limited so that they would not lose their voucher. The daughter-in-law was also assigned
	as a caregiver along with the spouse to receive needed in home services and maintain their subsidy.
	5. <u>Update on Veteran Services Program Grant</u> (Bobbie Lawrence) – Courtney Edwards has moved to a new
	department. Her position is posted, and, in the meantime, Bobbie is handling her cases. They are currently
	assisting Veterans with back rent, gas and food cards, and are obtaining resources for a Veteran to avoid tax sale
	on his property.
	6. Report on VA Claims & Benefits Clinic (Bobbie Lawrence) – Bobbie reported that approximately 93 Veterans
	were served through the Claims Clinic and 37 Veterans received information at the Resource Fair.
New Business	1. Voting for FY2023 Chair and Vice-Chair – Nominations received were Bill Nash for Chair and Jim Duncan and
	Steve Whisler for Vice-Chair. The results for FY2023: Bill Nash was elected Chair and Steve Whisler was elected to
	Vice-Chair.
Announcements	1. Bill Murphy: Currently working with the Buddy Project. They are a group of students with Autism who repair
	computers and give to those with disabilities. Friends of Disabled Veterans in Carroll County has been
	transporting Veterans to Washington, DC for appointments with specialists such as Cardiology. They have also
	received a donation of \$50,000 from the Kahlert Foundation. The donation will be used for a new van. They are
	also currently collecting donations of vehicles and power chairs. They currently have many walkers and
	wheelchairs. Their new website is doing great and has received a good amount of traffic already.
