DIRECTOR'S REPORT



Bob Hicks, Director

It is with great pleasure that we present our 2024 Annual Report for the Carroll County Department of Recreation and Parks. Carroll County is a community committed to quality living. This commitment is consistent with the County's recreation and park system that offers an outstanding network of park facilities, natural areas, open spaces and year-round recreational activities. In today's busy and fast paced world, it is easy to forget and take the time to enjoy each day and how important it is to our health and well-being. We are committed to insuring that every resident has an opportunity to experience and enjoy the excellent recreational activities and park facilities that enhance their quality of life.

We serve our residents with over 30 developed parks and thousands of acres of open space and recreational facilities that are visited by thousands of people annually. Our facilities include nature centers, playgrounds, athletic facilities, trails, a public shooting range, boat launch areas, a planetarium, picnic areas, basketball/tennis/pickleball courts, ponds and even a model airplane airfield.

In January 2024, the Community Parks Maintenance Staff was added to our department to maintain all the non-staffed parks in Carroll County. They are in the parks on a regular basis and has been making great strides in conducting preventive maintenance work on our existing amenities including, power washing tennis/basketball courts, picnic tables and playground equipment, in addition to coordinating our mowing contractor, installing benches and trees as part of the Park Legacy Fund, removing fallen dead trees and brush and making various repairs in our parks.

On May 18th the Department was honored to host a dedication ceremony for the Blue Star Memorial Marker and Westminster Veterans Memorial Park Garden. It was well attended despite the rainy weather.

The County's volunteer recreation councils continued their commitment to providing quality programs in 2024, donated 288,208 hours of service to the community. In addition, our Community Recreation Programs expanded their programming numbers to 6,615 registrants – an increase of over 16% from the previous year.

A number of park improvements were completed this year including field lighting at Cape Horn Park, a disc golf course at Krimgold Park, a new parking lot at Freedom Park, the replacement of two pavilions (one at Freedom Park and the other at Piney Run Park), renovations/repairs to Hashawha's swimming pool and a playground resurfacing/Gaga Ball Pit addition to Leister Park.

These are just some of the highlights of the many projects and activities our dedicated staff has worked on in the past year. We continue to take pride in our accomplishments and welcome your ideas, thoughts and suggestions to help us serve you better. We are proud to be a part of making Carroll County a great place to live, to work and to play.








WHY ARE FEES CHARGED AT SOME PARKS BUT NOT OTHERS?

Several of our large park facilities provide a higher service level that results in additional operating expenses. Other areas such as our dog parks and community recreation programs were created with the understanding that revenues would largely support their operation. These fees generated revenue in the amount of \$926,285 recovering most of the approved operating budgets for these areas.







As a means to fulfill our vision of promoting life long learning opportunities. Carroll County Department of Recreation & Parks offers a wide variety of activities through its Community Recreation Programs. These activities are designed to supplement the many programs that are available through the recreation councils and include a wide variety of activities designed to stimulate both the mind and body. Program guides are published four times per year with activities available for adults, youth, families and adaptive recreation at sites throughout the County. Over 5,000 registrants participated in these programs in FY2024.

RECREATION COUNCILS

The Carroll County Department of Recreation & Parks is proud to support the operation of twelve (12) volunteer recreation councils, each serving a specific geographic community or a county-wide interest group. These councils play a critical role in delivering various recreational services to the community. In addition to providing staff support, the Department administers facility usage, assists with program publicity, and manages liability insurance concerns.

To further enhance their effectiveness, recreation councils worked to obtain their 501(c)(3) non-profit status in FY24. This designation allows them to expand their fundraising efforts, apply for grants, and receive tax-deductible donations, ensuring long-term sustainability and growth. The councils hold regular meetings open to the public governed by their By-laws, each executive board is elected by community members.
