Acceptable Items (examples)

- * Gas/Gas Oil Mix
- * Oil Based Paints, Stains, & Sealants
- * Paint Thinners
- * Solvents
- * Household Cleaners
- * Pesticides/Insecticides
- * Herbicides
- * Photographic Chemicals
- * Pool Cleaners
- * CFL/Fluorescent Tubes
- * Household Use Nickel-Cadmium, NIMH, and Lithium Batteries
- * Vape Liquids in Consumer Containers & Electronic Smoking Device Batteries

Medications and Sharps

- * Prescription, Over the Counter, & Pet Medications (no liquids)
- * Supplements
- * Syringes, Needle Tips, Lancets, & Auto-Injectors

Document Shredding

Sensitive documents will be shredded and securely destroyed.

- Up to 3 bags or *Banker's Boxes* (approx. 24"x15"x10")

Shredding is available until the truck is full.

Unacceptable Items

- * Latex paint, water-based stains & sealants(1)
- * Explosives/Ammunition
- * Asbestos
- * Medical Waste: e.g. bandages, bags, tubing etc.
- * Biohazard Waste
- * Radioactive Materials
- * Single Use Household Batteries (Alkaline)
- * Vehicle Batteries (2)
- * Motor Oil/Antifreeze (2)
- * Propane/Compressed Gas Tanks (2)
- * Liquid Medications, Illicit Drugs, Cannabis Products

1. Latex paint, and water-based stains, & sealants are not hazardous waste and can be disposed in regular trash once solidified by using an absorbent such as kitty litter, sand, mulch, shredded paper.
2. Vehicle batteries, motor oil/antifreeze, kerosene, and small propane tanks are accepted year round at our Northern Landfill Recycling Center 1400 Baltimore Blvd, Westminster, MD 21157.
